CTTN is no more

As sent in an E-mail to net control stations, effective immediately, CTTN (Central Texas Traffic Net) is eliminated from the net call-up sequence, and statistics will no longer be reported for it. Rodney, W5DY, confirmed this and provided the following additional information:

CTTN no longer exists. I have not been able to find anyone who can get it going again. They developed repeater problems a couple of years ago and have not been able to come up with a solution. In the period of inactivity, there seems to be a great loss of interest by the former members, so I guess it is done for.

TEX Mailbox:

Heard from **Tom, K4VIZ**, a regular on RN5 from AR, in response to my plea last month to originate some traffic to family and friends. Tom wrote: I generated 4 pieces of original traffic. NONE has yet to be delivered. We are done for, dinosaurs. 1 to Rhode Island, 2 to Georgia, 1 to Mass. Not a really good average for message delivery. Tom / K4VIZ

As a follow-up, **Frank, W4DLZ**, the RN5 manager wrote the following: Hello All, Recently myself and others have encouraged NTS members to originate traffic to friends, family members and other Hams. Use RadioGrams instead of EMail when you can... and I have begun to see real traffic being originated and sent.

Tom K4VIZ and others have been putting traffic of this type into the system lately and we've been very pleased to see this. It's especially needed now as ARRL is definitely taking a close look at NTS and each of us need to do a good job.

Now you need to know that I am extremely upset !!! Tom is Livid !!

Over a week ago K4VIZ, Tom, originated four NTS messages to family members. They were put on EAN, going to Holden, MA, Wonsocket, RI, Atlanta and Rome GA.

Not only has the traffic not been delivered, but K4VIZ hasn't been serviced back... NADA!!

This is Horrible, the worst thing that could happen!! I may ask Tom to let me resend the traffic with HXD instructions. I am going to find out what happened and hope this is not now a Laissez-Faire attitude by NTS people. Hopefully just a few, but one rotten apple spoils the barrel!!

If this is the way the Members feel about delivering traffic then I recommend NTS be shut down!!!! This is from me, a guy who sent his first RadioGram as a Novice in 1954... 57 years ago.

(From a follow-up email)

I'm informed the two GA messages have finally been delivered. The addressees asked replies be sent and none have, so far. The messages were sent on the 9th of January and two were just recently delivered in GA (Jan 16).

As far as I'm concerned this is too long. We are supposed to demonstrate to the ARRL that NTS is a viable substitute for delivery of messages when the infrastructure goes down. A wise old Sage recently told me, this was a Hobby, not a paying job. But Sage, Nowhere does the FCC say Amateur Radio is a Hobby, instead FCC says in the rules it is a public service only...

Having said all this I again ask you to generate traffic to friends and associates preferably using HXD/E. Thanks again.

Apex of dipole is only 25 feet, but just got an e-mail QSL from KL7RA (QSO on one of the 160M contests) so must be working!!

Pat, KD5TXD, has quite a few things going on. Here are her inputs: Hi All, I should maybe update everyone on the status of Charles' antenna tower. I am sure you remember me talking about the wonderful crank up/tilt down 51 foot antenna tower that I purchased for Charles for Christmas half a decade ago... It's the one I hang laundry on to dry. Well, over the Christmas holiday Charles had a fellow come out with one of those wonderful scoopi machines and they dug the most beautiful 4 foot by 4 foot by 5 foot deep hole for the antenna tower base.
