The 7290 Traffic Net picnic was held this year on May 12 once again at the SPJST Lodge Hall in Beyersville (Taylor), TX. Rodney, W5DY, represented TEX and announced the Pfeiffer Pfist award going to Pete, K5GM. Pete was not present, so Rodney shipped it to him.

Here is what Rodney reported: Took a few pictures at the picnic (two included here – see below). WA5YZD, Roy from Austin, talked about the help of the 7290 net during hurricane Harvey.

There were myself, Randy N5RL, Gary K5QOW and Doug NA5YO for Tex CW in attendance.

The Tex CW portion of the picnic went well with Pete K5GM being honored as the recipient of the PP Award. I then read the speech you sent me:

Good afternoon everyone and thanks to Rodney for once again filling in as TEX manager in my absence. I would really like to be with you all, but medical conditions prevent that at present.

Thank you all for your continued excellence in handling traffic. The 7290 and Texas Traffic Nets handle the majority of messages destined for not only Texas but also adjoining states

such as Oklahoma, Louisiana and Arkansas and some further away as well. The TEX net handles very few by comparison, and most of those either leave via 7290 and TTN liaisons, notably W5FEA and N5RL, or enter TEX to go to the region net, notably via W5DY as well as W5FEA. Many thanks to the liaison stations on TEX.

I also want to especially thank George, K5BMR, and of course Jo Ann, KA5AZK, for providing liaison services via digital to and from my station. Much of the digital traffic goes to them for relay on 7290.

Although conditions have been poor recently on 40 meters during the day, thank you all for staying with it and continuing to support the nets. In spite of the awful propagation, traffic totals for the last 2 months have been outstanding and the best in the years I have been keeping track of them. On the upper nets of Radio Relay International, including region and area, traffic for March was 2,832 on the voice and CW nets, while April was 2,723. The digital traffic was even higher than normal, at 8,647 in March and an astounding 11,356 in April for total traffic in the Central Area of 11,489 in March and 14,119 in April. Much of the digital traffic for Texas and Arkansas is also sent for distribution via the 7290 net and also TTN via the TEX liaison and K5BMR and KA5AZK. In fact, the 7290 Traffic Net is the only way to get traffic into Arkansas, the local nets there refuse to handle any traffic.

So the system remains healthy and once again, thanks to all of you for your dedication.

Now, Rodney will talk about the Pfeiffer Pfist award, which goes to Pete Jordahl, K5GM, this year. Pete has been an active traffic handler, primarily on the CW nets, for over 50 years and is quite deserving of this honor. Unfortunately, he is also unable to be here today. As some of you may know, Pete is confined to a wheelchair due to having had childhood polio. He requires an assistant to transport him and help him. His assistant was not available to work today, so Pete was unable to come.

Over to you now, Rodney, and thanks for everything you do to help TEX and the 7290 traffic net. 73 to all. Steve K6JT, TEX Manager and Central Area Coordinator of the Radio Relay International system.

### K5RG's Trip to 9N Land

In my past trips to Nepal and specifically Namche Bazaar, the Sherpa capitol in the Everest region, I've looked at a single tea house/hotel off in the distance from Namche located on a distant mountain top. This location had to have a commanding view of the entire Mt. Everest valley. I thought about visiting the location named Kongde in 2014 with the XYL Camille but my outfitter said that the only viable plan would be to fly to the tea house via helicopter. Not letting go of the plan, this year I decided to trek by myself to the location against the better advice of my outfitter. The trek to Namche Bazaar took 3 days and it would take another 3 days of trekking to keep the daily altitude gain to Kongde within safe limits (1000 feet per day).

The last day would be the crux of the trip since there is no civilization except at the end points of the path. With my guide Sonam Sherpa, my porter Phuna, I left Thame (3800 meters) at 5 AM heading to Kongde pulling in 12 hours later. It was harder than expected since the path initially went to 4000 meters but then dropped down to 3200 meters before reaching Kongde at 4250 meters/14,000 feet. By the end of the long day, I felt like I had actually climbed it

twice. The 3 days spent at the tea house were well worth the effort even with the daily cloud cover not allowing a completely clear day but typical for the premonsoon period. It is exciting watching the clouds roll in at your feet. The trek down was a more direct path, only taking 4 hours but with an altitude loss of 1640 meters/5280 feet. I then returned back to Kathmandu and took a quick 3-day trip to Nepal's vacation spot Pokhara



before returning to W/K land, a 20-hour flight with a time difference of 11 hours and 45 minutes, almost exactly on the opposite side of the world from Texas. It is good to be back with the high temperatures, high humidity and high QRN but home nonetheless.

My favorite picture of the trek is shown above. Everest is off of my left shoulder with the peak just in the clouds.

### **TEX Net Topics**

The TEX Duty Schedule and Roster are shown below. Rodney's new duty schedule seems to be working out well, although some of us still have trouble keeping track of the changes.

CAN and WAN and early RN5 have changed to 40 meters. TEX and late RN5 continue on 80 meters. There are no immediate plans to move TEX or late RN5 to 40 meters, but it could happen if conditions continue to deteriorate in this time of sunspot minima. One change might be for early TEX to move to 40, which is always the prerogative of the NCS.

# Operating:

I again remind all who handle the KB4RGC messages for CWOPS and FISTS participants, for which the place of origin is either in New Mexico or Louisiana, depending on the location of the message signatory, that problems may arise with service messages. The messages also have HXC on them, so a return service message is solicited. Those service messages should be sent to KB4RGC, who is located in Raleigh, NC. While what he is doing is correct – place of origin is that of the signatory, there are many operators who do not check his location and simply route to the place of origin, which is incorrect. I have started putting an OP NOTE after the signature on all of these that I relay saying to Reply to KB4RGC Raleigh NC 27610. I also asked KB4RGC to change his format to include this line (and I encourage any of you relaying these to do the same). KB4RGC agreed to do so but said it would take some time. I have not seen any from him with the op note since that exchange.

If you get any service messages for him in Louisiana or New Mexico, please re-route them to the proper place. Do not attempt to send LA to RN5 for the Louisiana rep (WA5CAV) or the TTN / 7290 nets for a Louisiana QNI.

Field Day is coming up the last weekend of June (23-24). TEX will observe the normal schedule but will likely need to use 3595 as net frequency. I suspect RN5 will use 7108 early and possibly also for late if not 3598. CAN will also likely use 7108. See the alternate frequencies on the Net Schedule and Roster page.

Here are the composite reports for the last 2 months for traffic handled at the region and above levels. Some reports were only partially complete due to illness or resignation of the respective managers, as indicated in the notes. April was an outstanding month once again.
