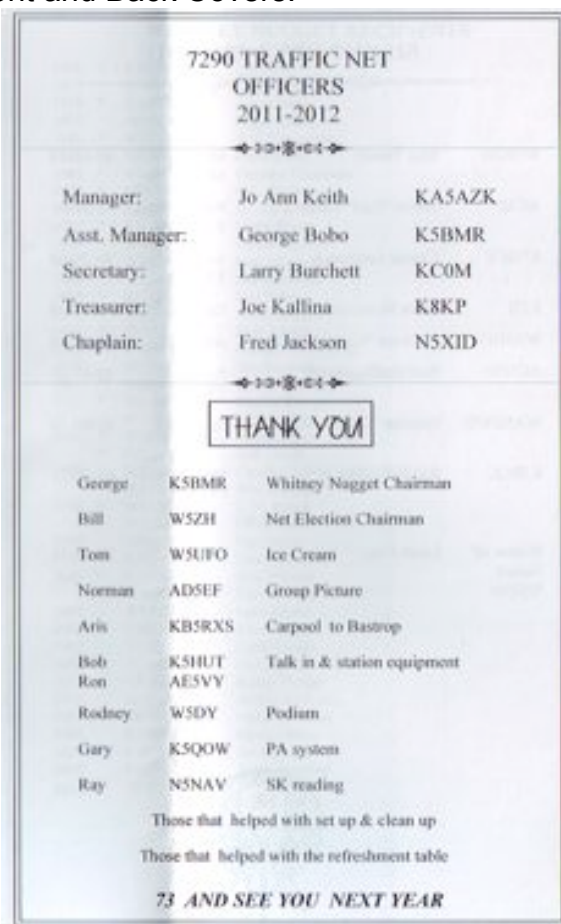

Rodney Baker W5DY - Amateur Radio Resume

Rodney sent this in as a "starter" for a series we would like to run here in the newsletter. But we need inputs from the rest of you to make it work. Just a short synopsis of your amateur radio "history" and current activities is all that is needed. Here's Rodney's:

First licensed in 1975 as a novice WN5TAY, Tech license in 1975 WB5TAY, General in 1975 same call, Advanced in 1978 KF5JW.

Extra in 1978 same call. I was active in traffic nets on CW from 1975 to 1991. I was active in traffic nets on SSB from 1977 to 1991 (mic in the closet for 2 years).

I started working overseas in the oilfield in 1991 and did not work HF for 15 years. Although I gave up HF, I was still active on VHF/UHF. I retired from the oilfield in 2004 and started on HF again in 2006. I changed my call to W5DY in 2006. CW is my preferred mode, but am also active on SSB, both primarily on traffic nets. I was a net control on the Texas Traffic Net for almost 2 years from 2006 to 2008. I am very active on the Texas CW NTS Section Traffic Net (Tex CW) both as net control and RN5 liaison. I am also the assistant net manager of the Tex CW net. I have had a schedule on the Trans Continental Corps 2 nights a week as Station Fox since 2008.

I was appointed South Texas Section Traffic Manager in January 2008 and was appointed EC of Goliad County in 2009. I work HF and VHF/UHF from my home, my truck, and portable from my motorhome.

I am active in Field Day, the Texas Water Safari, Special Event Station W5G at the Goliad County Fair, and the Missions Tour de Goliad bike ride.

2011 Pfeiffer Pfist Award

The recipient of the 2011 Pfeiffer Pfist award will be announced at the 7290 picnic. Since neither the new recipient nor Scott, last year's recipient, can make it to the picnic or HamCom in June, the award was shipped by Scott, W5ESE, and it should be in the new recipient's hands before the picnic. I hope to have pictures next month to share. I won't spoil the fun of the picnic by announcing it here at this time.

Inside a Nuclear Reactor Containment Dome

Pat, KD5TXD, was lucky enough to be on a field trip to a nuclear power plant in south Texas. She sent in this report for all to enjoy.

This gives new meaning to the song You Light Up My Life. I got to tag along with the TAMUK physics students on their field trip to the South Texas Project nuclear power plant. Dr. Kenison has an "in" with someone at the plant and they are getting desperate for new employees to work at the nuclear plant, so the trip was scheduled when the plant was shut down for maintenance. We got to go into the containment dome where they were changing out fuel assemblies. Megga cool!!

It was a very long drive with a dozen college students. We arrived an hour early for our tour, which is a great indication of how much Dr. Kenison wanted the drive to be over. Charles could not come with us because he had scheduled an Astronomy Open House night that day. There was no way to plan for this trip because the power plant people simply called and said come today or you don't get the special tour inside the containment dome.

All of the students are in the nuclear physics program at TAMUK and several of them are very interested in working at the plant after graduation. Normal tours don't go anywhere near the containment dome. Under normal working conditions it is sealed, no lighting, no cameras. But during these maintenance sessions the containment dome is buzzing with folks in protective gear with radios attached to their heads and tiny antennas sticking up so they can all talk to each other while working.

Every wall has a large poster with ITU phonetics to remind the workers to make their communications exact. One of our tour guides was the head of their emergency response department. He compared their reactors with Japan's reactors. Our reactors can take a 1.9G earthquake (not sure what 1.9G means in relation to the Richter scale), a Japan size tsunami (which everyone keeps telling me the Gulf Coast can't have), the impact of a Boeing 767 fully loaded with fuel, and a cat. 6 hurricane (another supposedly fictitious creature). They are pretty sure of themselves.

Their backup diesel generators for emergency use, the ones that Japan's tsunami destroyed, are housed in a reinforced building so they won't be destroyed like Japan's were. Their cooling water reservoir is 7,000 acres surrounded by a 39 foot embankment and averages 45 feet deep. That reservoir is home to lots of fish, birds and 15+ foot long alligators. I did not linger long on the banks of the reservoir lest I have a close encounter of the alligator kind.

They currently have two reactors. They have two in the planning stage. The new units are on hold due to the events in Japan. Security at the site was amazing. We had to register all of our people with them before the trip. Then when we arrived we had to sign more forms. We had to turn in our ID's for background checks. I lost count on all the security stations we passed through. Our tour was split into three groups. Each group was passed through the security checks with our tour guide. There was a glitch on one of the security points and armed guards came out to surround our group, with real guns and real bullets, to find out what had happened. It was a miss-swiped security card that caused the problem and they allowed us to proceed. We all wore dosimeters for the tour and none of us registered any radiation.

I figure I will never have such an opportunity to tour the inside of a reactor containment dome again in my life so I left Charles behind and had a thrill touring the South Texas Project Nuclear Plant. Sorry, no pics allowed. 73!! Pat KD5TXD

P.S. Our Dr. Kenison, who took us all to see the power plant, has done some research on the Japan disaster. We were told a couple things that were in error while on our trip. Our tour guide said the 50 workers who stayed to try to secure the Japanese nuclear plants were walking dead from over exposure to radiation. Well, Dr. Kenison analyzed that and the reports from the Japanese nuclear commission and determined that those 50 workers were OK. They had the equivalent of a year's worth of background radiation, which will not kill them. They may have life spans shortened by one year or 1% more chance of getting cancer, but they are not walking dead any more that the rest of us. Dr. Kenison did a presentation at TAMUK on that topic last week. Thought it was pretty interesting how a bad situation is being hyped for media ratings and public scare tactics to seem far worse than it is. OK... thanks and 73!! Pat KD5TXD

As more information becomes available, I will send it out by separate email, since I am not likely to have a newsletter out next month in time.

As of this writing, I know that Ken, K5RG, plans to attend but Rodney is unable to make it due to the Texas Water Safari activities taking place that weekend. Anyone else planning to attend? Please let me know so we can coordinate getting together for the breakfast. There may or may not be an announcement in the HamCom program – Ken sent in a request with the information some time ago but never heard back.

Statistics:

Traffic was about the same as last month, on average, but check-ins were down a bit.

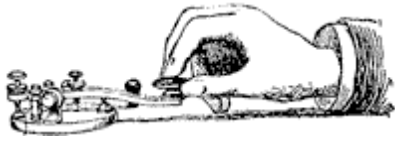
As I announced in an all-hands E-mail, the official early TEX alternate net frequency is now 7053. I had local QRM on 7108, and 7052 seems to be busy most of the time. Although we have not completely moved any early sessions to 7053, it has been useful for passing traffic during noisy (close T-storm) evenings. It is up to the NCS to decide to move or not, with an announcement on 3541 prior to moving. If you don't hear anyone on 3541, check 7053 and 3643 before giving up (or better yet, before starting the net yourself).

Note also that most of the CAN NCS stations (myself included) have moved to 40 meters, using 7052 +/- QRM. PAN has officially moved there as of the start of this month as well, and it is a big relief to my ears on my TCC Fox skeds to not have to listen to the loud atmospheric noise of 80 meters.
