3541 Again

As you are aware, the early session of TEX moved back to the winter frequency of 3541 on November 4 when the time reverted to Standard. From all indications, this is working well and signals are reasonably strong at that time. So far there has been enough sunspot activity to prevent long skip from occurring on late TEX. Let's hope this winter season will be a stable one.

Hurricane Sandy

I did not see any traffic coming through either digital or CW in the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy. In general, I understand the cell phone system continued to operate in nearly every area. I did see a request from the Pacific Digital Coordinator to hold all Routine traffic to the affected area since delivery was impossible in many places.

My daughter in the southeast part of Connecticut lost power for 3 days, but otherwise there was no damage at her place. They had power just across the border in Rhode Island, so she was able to keep her cell phone and computer charged up during the interval and had prepared ahead for the power outage. My daughter in Pittsburgh just had lots of rain and wind but otherwise she was far enough from the rivers (actually up in the hills) so did not experience any other problems, nor did her power fail.

We Survived the CW Sweepstakes

We managed to survive CW Sweepstakes weekend by moving to the alternate 3643 frequency. Hope some of you were able to operate a little during the SS. I operated for a little over a half hour, primarily to get some contacts to whom I could send radiograms thanking them for the contact and urging them to consider becoming active in the CW NTS nets.

I have no plans to dust the cobwebs off the microphone sitting on a cabinet shelf to operate Phone SS this weekend. At least the CW frequencies should be relatively clear. There could be some RTTY QRM, though, as other contests are also ongoing. Likely not going to bother 3541.

Statistics:

Traffic and checkins were slightly up from September. Good job once again y'all, and no RN5 slots were missed.

Benny, K5KV, again had excellent participation with 48 out of 62 (77%) taking first, followed by Rodney, W5DY, in 2nd with 43 (69%). Randy, N5RL, with 41 (66%) was 3rd. Thanks to all of you who checked in for your support. It was another very good month.

We did not have any Texas visitors to the net, but we received welcome visits by Frank, W4DLZ, from FL, Dick, WA5CAV, from LA, and Dean, W8IM, from FL.

The complete list of stations and traffic / liaison totals are shown in the following table. Traffic averaged 4.3 per net session (4.2 last month). Net time averaged 13.0 minutes per session (compared to 12.1 last month). Check-ins averaged 5.9 per session (5.3 last month).

Operating:

This section is normally devoted to tips on good net operation. I must say that all of you are doing a great job and don't need tutoring. But for those newer operators and particularly for those considering an NCS or RN5 liaison, I have a few things.

NCS stations are reminded to immediately pair up a couple stations to handle traffic off frequency as soon as they check in, even if the standard callup has not been completed. This gets things moving quickly and shortens the net time for everyone. An exception is when a given station (usually RN5 liaison) has a large number (more than 2) messages to send to a single destination station and other destination stations may still be waiting to check in. In that case, it is wise to wait until after all liaisons have been called and a general QNI invitation has been made. The rule of thumb is to clear stations with fewer messages before stations with more messages.

Regarding RN5 liaison. We have only one open slot, and volunteers generally are good about covering it in an ad hoc fashion. But it would be better to have either a regular station or at least a backup station for that slot (both are needed). RN5 liaison does take a little more of your time that evening, but traffic is usually light and you can expect less than 10 minutes on early RN5 unless you have several messages to send. Late RN5 is also not too time consuming. While all late slots are currently covered, note that Benny, K5KV, has 3 of the 7, which is a bit too many to ask of him. His other duties (such as CAN liaison from RN5 or TCC or CAN NCS) make it easier for him on some nights, but I am sure he would appreciate some help and it is best to not burden any single station with more than 2 nights of liaison duties. Anyone willing to give any of the slots a shot? Let me know.

Again, a very big THANK YOU to all of you who are supporting the net. It really makes all the time I spend worthwhile and satisfying. Send in your comments, too, and any anecdotes that may be of interest to others.

Hello again and welcome to edition Nine of the RN5 Corner.

First, as most of you know, the early session of RN5 has moved to its winter frequency of 3567 KHz (3598 during contests). Conditions seem to be pretty good at that time. 7108 can still be used for passing traffic between distant stations as required and as assigned by the NCS and/or requested by either station.

Welcome back to Tom, WA4ZPZ. Now that darkness comes earlier, he is able to raise his antenna without fear of the dreaded CC&R police. Tom has resumed his Tuesday CAN and Thursday NCS slots (see the updated duty roster), and we are VERY glad to have him back.

I would also like to welcome the new liaison stations from AL that Tom has recruited (good job, Tom!) to support RN5. In particular, please join me in welcoming Ben, KZ8Q, and Jerry, W4SU, who have both now been added to the RN5 Roster. It is great to have your support along with stalwarts W4AGL, K4AKC, K4VIZ, and of course Sir Pat W4QAT.
